New council website

1.0 Background

The most recent move to ensure councils provide information digitally has come through the introduction of the Transparency Code (April 2015) which calls for councils with less than £25,000 precept to now put a range of financial and other information on-line through a website. We comply with the minimum requirements and go beyond that by posting almost all our council documents online.

The MPC website contains a large quantity of information relating to parish community groups and businesses that was published in 2010. It has never been updated (and we have never received complaints about it being out of date). In 2022, communities and businesses use their own Facebook pages to promote themselves with information that is topical and accurate.

2.0 Current content management

Problems in maintaining current site in a workable way

- Wordpress system needs someone with specialist skills to post and maintain the content.
- Being able to understand layout tools (headings, fonts, sizes, colour)
- Uploading documents and inserting them into the site
- Clerk has to maintain community information
