2	<b>Review of last year projects and actions</b> <b>Village in Bloom</b> <i>Keith explains the difference between NGS</i> <i>(charity) and BMM (competition) that have</i> <i>different aims with different future plans.</i>	All agreed that Menheniot would enter the RHS Village Pennant Category again in 2025. MG will coordinate the Village entry but individual groups may enter their own projects.
