Progress report and Work Plan for Menheniot Parish Council from

Introduction

A meeting was held on the 6th December 2024 to reflect on the project work undertaken last year and to propose a work plan for the next year for consideration by the Parish Council.

It was also an opportunity to confirm the Working Groups Terms of Reference and whether any changes were recommended.

The meeting was well attended and presented a good representation of those involved.

The minutes of that meeting form part of and are referenced in this report.

Review of projects 2024.

It was recognised that again Cllr Keith Goldsmith had led the Menheniot Village's very successful entry to the National Open Garden Scheme. Keith was congratulated on his efforts in bringing together 5 private gardens and three community spaces to be enjoyed by the visitors who attended and for the monies raised for the RHS nominated charities. The open gardens also contributed to the judges visit for the Village in Bloom competition.

Building on that interest Menheniot Green on behalf of the Parish entered the RHS Village in Bloom Pennant Cup. The entry won overall with a gold award and took the cup. Well done to all, individuals and community groups and thanks to all of our sponsors which meant that the project was self funding. Sponsors have been thanked personally and given a copy of the certificate. Some additional awards were given for individual elements and community areas.

Tree of life project continues with 16 taking up the offer of a tree at the start of the current school year.

Wilding and wild flowers bed these brought a lot of pleasure to residents and impressed the judges in the Village in Bloom.

Community Garden is thriving and again an intrinsic part of the local community.

Geothermal Energy has not progressed as far as was hoped due to external shifts in the market for renewables and economic uncertainty.

Work plan

RHS Village Pennant Cup it is proposed that Menheniot Green enter this year. Groups can still enter their own individual projects.

NGS It was hoped that the Garden Clubs would work together and encourage more gardens to open.

Tree of life to continue with MPC support

MPC to continue to support the community spaces and wild flower beds.

Continue to push for opportunities in the Parish for geothermal energy projects.

Support and input to Cornwall Residents Energy Plan

Input into MPC Vision for East Rd field.

Opportunity to work with the Cricket Club on future projects.

Opportunity to support EV charging provision in the Parish
